IRBA Teaming with NPS to Provide Bait for Isle Royale Fishermen - Dave Hand

In April of this year the NPS instituted a ban on bringing cut bait (smelt, sucker, herring, etc) to the island. According to the NPS the ban is to slow the potential spread of the VHS virus in the Lake Superior and especially Isle Royale waters to protect the fishery. In May, I discussed this issue with IR park superintendant Phyllis Green and voiced concerns on behalf of fishermen who use cut bait for sport fishing. Phyllis had already realized this would be a problem with many fishermen and had begun to mobilize some park resources towards getting clean certified cut bait to IR for fishermen. Just after Memorial weekend, I received some phone calls from concerned fishermen that there was no cut bait available on the Island. I contacted Phyllis to see if IRBA could help the NPS provide cut bait to fishermen. At that time, Phyllis had already ordered two freezers, had installed electrical outlets in Rock Harbor and Windigo near the docks. In addition, she had already located a fishery in Duluth to supply smelt after they have been virus-free tested in Lansing MI. I suggested to Phyllis that IRBA could get involved by donating the freezers, and help maintain them. In addition, I suggested that we also have sucker and herring available as well. Phyllis agreed as long as the bait is certified as virus free and the NPS will pay for the bait testing. The virus testing may take a few weeks to complete.

Presently, we are purchasing sucker from Superior Fisheries in Duluth MN. Our present plan is to try to have bait on IR by June 21, (2008 ©). Tentatively, the NPS will have bait available in freezers during regular park hours and the freezers will be locked during off hours to prevent vandalism. When the fishery receives herring we will work on getting some purchased, VHS-free certified and available for use. We apologize to some fishermen for not getting this project underway sooner but at least it is happening. I would like to give the NPS credit for getting this process started. This ban is an inconvenience for many fishermen, but I also know that we do need to take steps to protect our IR fishery for generations to come.

Sixth Annual Fishing Tournament By Dave Hand

For you fishermen, we will be holding the 6th Annual IRBA Fishing Tournament on Saturday morning (July 19) from sunrise to 2:00 PM. The tournament is a fundraiser with a cash prize for the boat that catches the three largest lake trout by weight. The cash prize will be one half of the tournament proceeds. Plaques will be awarded to the first and second place teams, with the three largest fish and a trolling plaque for the three largest fish (Plaques courtesy of John Evans). A plaque will also be given for the largest fish caught. This year the entry fee will be \$10.00 per person.

This year the "Wooden Herring Award," will also be up for grabs. This award is given to either the Minnesota or Yooper (Michigan) fishermen for the three largest fish by weight. The Yoopers presently have the bragging rights from last year's stunning upset on the West end.

We would like entry requests be made by 7 PM on Friday, July 18. Dave Hand (Dr. Trout) will be at Caribou Dock to take the entry request by marine radio or in person. The entry fee can be paid before the day of the tournament or at the time of weigh-in as long as you have made the entry request. If you have questions please contact Dave Hand (906) 370 - 7354. Again this year, Buck LeVasseur from TV6 News in Marquette Michigan will be on hand to capture all the fishing excitement.
